A few of the many foothill wildflowers to watch for in coming weeks are the Death Lily/White Camas, Bachelor Buttons, and Syringa. Orange Globe Mallow and Currents should be showing up in June. Many other flowers, with a little rain this month, should be blooming in June. Sometimes, what doesn't look like what you would think of as a flower can be interesting anyway. Just look for color that doesn't seem to belong there. I hiked some of the Table Rock trails recently and saw Globe Mallow, a couple of patches of Prickly Pear Cactus and the Stork's Beak so there are some of those that will be lingering into June.
